Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

May we begin by thanking you all for your generous Christmas Offerings and the many gifts and presents we received. Also, for the many cards and the messages of support and encouragement they contained. These mean a great deal. Thank you! We hope your Christmas and New year went peacefully and you like us, are ready to face the challenges of 2022.

The Pandemic has challenged us all in many ways, and once more we wish to acknowledge the great effort made by those of you who were able to help us through these difficult times.

One of the unseen effects of the pandemic is our churches have been pushed 10 years into the future. As this moment many of our regular parishioners and our young families have not returned to Mass. Some have chosen, for a variety of reasons, to discontinue to practice of their faith and contribution to the life of the Catholic Community. Our numbers, like everywhere in the diocese and the country, have not returned to the levels we had pre-pandemic.

Sick and Housebound numbers have also increased dramatically, and at this moment we are still unable to commit to regular priestly visits. We pray we can do so soon.

In addition, during the pandemic for a number of reasons, both pastoral and fiscal, we committed to ministry in both the Hospital and the High School. Both are vitally important strands of our ministries.

Despite our strenuous efforts to maintain and continue some semblance of normal life in the enormous parish that is Our Lady Queen of Peace, there are still those who either with malicious gossip or unfair comparisons seek to undermine the good work of this large community.

At the beginning of the pandemic two priests of our diocese decided to leave the priesthood. At Christmas, another priest began an indefinite leave of absence. Whatever their reasons this leaves your priests deflated and depleted in the service of the Church in Hallam.

Change is an unspoken message of The Nativity scene. The advent of Christ, changed everyone's lives forever, be they parent or shepherd, Wise men or innocent bystander. So, it must be with us. Change and its many aspects is a central part of the Christian life. We must change often in the hope that we become more and more Christ like. To refuse change is a refusal to grow in our life in Christ.

At this moment we are truly blessed to have two full time priests in Our Lady Queen of Peace, a responsibility that was previously shared between seven full time priests. As we look to the future we cannot guarantee even this as the situation across the diocese continues to change.

None of us can predict the future. All we can do is read the signs of the times and make educated forecast of where we may be going. In so doing, our future will treasure the essential things of the past and adapt to accommodate our new circumstances.

In the coming weeks and months, we will come together to discuss how we continue on our journey and task of preaching the Gospel, both to ourselves and those around us. The way we will face the challenges of the future is together. We are One faith, One Parish family in God, and on One journey on the road to Salvation.
